



Echoes of the Living

Echoes of the Living explores how emerging technologies are reshaping not only our daily lives, but also how we deal with death and grief. Today, social media already creates digital footprints that can feel like 'afterlives', complicating how families process loss. As technologies like digital twins and Al become more advanced, we're starting to see new phenomena - such as "ghostbots" that recreate a person's voice or image, already in use in places like China. Even ads, like Microsoft's Copilot suggesting we could be in "three meetings at once," hint at a future where our presence could continue after death.

But society hasn't fully grappled with the emotional and ethical implications of this shift. This project imagines a future where AI and brain-computer interfaces bring digital versions of the dead into our everyday lives. It asks: how would we feel about seeing a lost loved one again - digitally?

Drawing inspiration from traditional rituals like Mexico's Day of the Dead and China's Qingming Festival, Echoes of the Living combines cutting-edge technology with spiritual customs. It uses digital storytelling, Al-generated visuals, and traditional Chinese music and art to create a reflective experience. The project invites us to consider what it means to be human, and raises important questions about who controls our digital selves, both in life and beyond.

QUALIFICATION STRUCTURE

Postgraduate Certificate | 60 credits

Postgraduate Certificate students complete TWO 30 credit components at Level 8. There are SIX 30 credit (non-sequential) components offered at NZQF Level 8.

Postgraduate Diploma | 120 credits

Postgraduate Diploma students complete FOUR 30 credit components at Level 8. If the student has completed the embedded Postgraduate Certificate then these 60 credits are applied to the Diploma and the student completes a further 60 credits. There are SIX 30 credit (non-sequential) components offered at NZQF Level 8.

Masters | 120 credits

Masters students complete TWO 30 credit components at Level 8, PLUS, ONE 15 credit and ONE 45 credit credit components at Level 9. There are SIX 30 credit (non-sequential) Level 8 components. At NZQF Level 9, there is ONE 15 credit component and ONE 45 credit component. These two components are sequential.
