





Look and Sign Memory Match

- Pick a flashcard and look at the picture or signs
- 2. Try to sign the picture with your hands or guess the sign
- 3. Check the answer if you got right
- ✓ If you're correct, awesome job! * If not, try again or ask someone to show you
- 4. Keep going until you can sign



- Place all cards face down in a grid (mix up signs and pictures)
- 2. Take turns flipping 2 cards at a time
- 3. Check the answer if you got right ✓ If the cards matches the correct
- picture or signs, keep the pair * If not, flip them back over and try to remember their spot
- 4. Keep playing until all cards run out
- 5. The player with the most pairs wins!
